Cwm Cynfal

The proposed power station in Cwm Cynfal campaign is still ongoing. Through a coordinated campaign with Snowdonia Society, Buglife, and North Wales Wildlife Trust, over 1,000 objections were made, with around half coming from locals.

Natural Resources Wales has made representations suggesting it is inappropriate for a National Park, and the decision has been pushed to 2025.

Press releases updating on the Cynfal Campaign have made it across the Welsh media throughout the year. In the autumn it was also a feature in the print and online version of the Guardian.

The planning decision has been pushed to 2025, and our campaign is ongoing.



UK General Elections

Tom trawled through the party's manifesto promises, looking at how each would impact on freshwater habitats and renewable energy. Digests of manifesto commitments were run alongside a campaign educating our audience on the value of voting, and debunking a number of common myths.

Save Our Rivers also partnered with Trash Free Trails, consulting on how the manifestos tackled the deposit return scheme, terrestrial pollution, and access to wild places.

Dan worked with Protect Our Rivers Europe to create a Manfesto from the Outdoor community signed by hundreds of outdoor brands and handed to EU politicians in Strasbourg, and aligned with athletes across Europe to get outdoor lovers out to vote in Ride, Bike, Climb, Vote campaign.

Kendal Mountain Festival

Led by our Lake District Representative, Dan Wilkinson, we partnered with Palm Equipment, Pyranha Kayaks, Trash Free Trails and Clean River Kent Campaign to host a River Clean. High river levels, and the third year of a "temporary" bridge across the river meant that we stayed bank based. Despite dreadful weather we were joined by over 30 volunteers and removed 1600 items of single use pollution from the river corridor.

It was also an opportunity to get a face to face update from the campaign team at Save the Heart of Kendal. It was saddening to see the impact the flood defence scheme is having on the town. It looks likely that whole phases of the scheme will now not be implemented, safeguarding further trees. The group are continuing to campaign for natural flood mitigations higher in the catchment.
